COMMISSIONERS' MEETING January 9, 2023 "Organizational Meeting"

The Bartholomew County Commissioners met on January 9, 2023, in the Commissioners Chambers of the Governmental Office Building, 440 Third Street, Columbus, Indiana. Commissioners Larry S. Kleinhenz, Carl H. Lienhoop and Tony London were present. Deputy Auditor Chris West, Attorney Grant Tucker, County Administrator Tina Douglas and Assistant County Administrator Brooke Bowers were present. Auditor Pia O'Connor was not present.

Deputy Auditor Chris West called the meeting to order. He gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Commissioners stated that Jeff Jones, John Cunningham, Dr. Tannenbaum, Dr. Newton, Jared Dickey, Julie Clore and James Smith were new appointees to the best of their recollection. Commissioner London stated that John Cunningham is the person that the movie "Addict's Wake" was based on and that since he has gotten clean, he has been very instrumental in helping others. They are glad to have him on board.

Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Approve the 2023 Commissioner Liaison Positions as listed. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of a 2023 Agreement with the Humane Society in the amount of \$125,000 (\$10,417.50 monthly). Commissioner Lienhoop motioned to Approve the 2023 Agreement with the Humane Society in the amount of \$125,000. Commissioner Kleinhenz seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of a 2023 Agreement for Legal Services with Attorney Grant Tucker in the amount of \$71,524 (\$5,960.34 monthly). Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Approve the 2023 Agreement with Attorney Grant Tucker in the amount of \$71,524. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of a 2023 Agreement for Medical Services with Amanda Velez in the amount of \$10,924.20 (\$910.35 monthly). This is the same amount as in 2022. Commissioner Lienhoop motioned to Approve the 2023 Agreement with Amanda Velez in the amount of \$10,924.20. Commissioner Kleinhenz seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of a 2023 Agreement with Danny Hollander as County Engineer in the amount of \$93,983 (\$3,614.70 bi-weekly). It was noted that the State provides \$40,000 of this amount. Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Approve the 2023 Agreement with Danny Hollander in the amount of \$93,983. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of a 2023 Agreement for Legal Services for the Bartholomew County Plan Commission with Attorney Jim Shoaf in the amount of \$18,000 (\$1,500 monthly). This is the same amount as in 2022. These funds come from the Code Enforcement Budget. **Commissioner Lienhoop motioned to Approve the 2023 Agreement with the Attorney Jim Shoaf in the amount of \$18,000. Commissioner Kleinhenz seconded the motion which passed unanimously.** Commissioner Kleinhenz asked Engineer Hollander the amount of his salary that the State reimburses. Engineer Hollander stated it is \$40,000. It was discussed that smaller counties, such as Brown and Jennings, do not have County Engineers, but instead they use consulting firms for their needed items. This is due to the size and population of their county. Commissioner Lienhoop guessed about 20 counties without Engineers. Engineer Hollander believes it to be much higher.

The next item was the Weekly Highway Crew Report for the last 2 weeks as presented by Engineer Hollander as follows: sprayed brine prior to snow event; patched with the Hot Box; cut trees & limbs; put up signs; plowed & salted roads; washed trucks; hauled off trash; crack sealed in Flatrock Township; cleaned deck drains & cut trees under the Southern Crossing bridge; and dug dirt off of the bridge on 800 S at the dead end. Someone had brought in dirt onto the bridge so that their equipment would go over the guardrails as the equipment was too wide to fit the bridge. Highway cleaned it up for the homeowner that lives beyond the bridge as he had been driving through the dirt. Commissioner London stated he had received several compliments on how well the Highway Department had handled the recent winter storm.

The next item was the Presentation of the November 2022 Financial Report and the December 2022 Crew Report as presented by Engineer Hollander. Commissioner Lienhoop motioned to Accept the Reports as presented. Commissioner Kleinhenz seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of Notice to Bidders for the 2023 Roadside Mowing Program as presented by Engineer Hollander as follows:

Commissioner London motioned to Approve the Notice To Bidders as presented. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion which passed unanimously. Ms. Ellen Macy, in the audience, asked if this included the median and sides of US 31 and SR 46. The Commissioners explained those are State property and therefore the responsibility of the State.

The next item was the Ratification of Expenditures for the Highway Department as presented by Engineer Hollander as follows:

Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Ratify the Expenditure with Frank's Tree Care in the amount of \$1,560 as presented. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Engineer Hollander stated that this could have waited until 2023, but the low bidder only had 1 tank in stock so they felt it was important to get it while they had it. Commissioner Lienhoop motioned to Ratify the low bid from Ohio Valley Ag in the amount of \$11,656.79 as presented. Commissioner Kleinhenz seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of Right-of-Way Dedication as presented by Director Jeff Bergman of the Planning Department (via Zoom) as follows:

Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Accept the Right-of-Way Dedication for the Ernie & Donna Dettmer Minor Subdivision as presented. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion

which passed unanimously. Commissioner Kleinhenz asked why the dedication was only for the Lot, and not on the remaining 20 acres. Director Bergman stated that is all that they are required to provide.

The next item was the Consideration of Contractor Agreements with the Recorders Office as presented by Recorder Tami Hines as follows:

Recorder Hines stated that they now have 63 years of records on-line. Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Accept the Contractor Agreements with the Recorder's Office as presented. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

All County Offices will be closed Monday, January 16, 2023 in Observance of Martin Luther King Jr Day. The next Commissioners Meeting will be Monday, January 23, 2023 at 10:00 a.m.

Commissioner London noted that last week, Larry Fisher had passed away. Mr. Fisher had served in positions as the County Coroner and the County Council. He was also heavily involved with 4-H and the Fair.

Commissioner Kleinhenz also noted that Ken Minnet, a good friend to County Government through various engineering firms had also passed away.

Under Miscellaneous, Ms. Ray asked if the Contract with the Humane Society was paid based on the number of animals that were taken there or was it a set amount. Commissioner London stated that it was a set amount for the year and divided up between the 12 months. All they have to do is submit a claim each month.

Ms. Sandra Bush stated it was very sad about Larry Fisher as she had worked for his wife for many years. She thanked the Commissioners for allowing her to present to them on the 19th of December. She noted that she has an active on-line petition with 811 citizens on it and a paper petition that is being taken to businesses in the county. She has 20 signatures on that one. She has found that there is a lot of confusion in the community regarding animal care, one of the confusions is that the Bartholomew County Humane Society is not owned/run by the County. There is also confusion regarding there being 2 sets of standards for animals; one the County standards and the other the City standards. She has volunteered for the food drives for both the Humane Society and C.A.R.E. She stated that someone may bring a cat and 8 kittens to the Humane Society who finds out that they live in the City, so they send them to the City or CARE, but the person will simply drop them in the road as they leave. She has talked with the owners of Phoenix Guns who are near the Humane Society and they have rescued 30 animals or so that they believe were from this situation. At the conclusion of the December 19th meeting, Commissioner Lienhoop stated that the Commissioners would give consideration to her presentation. She is anxious to know what they have come up with. She would like to extend an invitation to the Commissioners and the community to a meeting to be held on January 19, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. at 450 N Brewery.

Ms. Macy gave a follow up to the Commissioners on the case involving Thor. She stated that there had been a Motion to Dismiss on December 29, 2022 by the out-going Prosecutor.

Commissioner London reminded everyone of the first County Council Meeting that will be held tonight at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers next door.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:54 a.m.
