



Swimming Pool Contamination Incident Record

410 IAC 6-2.1-38 requires that any fecal event occurring in the pool be recorded. This record shall include the date and time, whether it involved formed stool or diarrhea, and the free chlorine and pH levels at the time of observation of the event. Before reopening the pool, the free chlorine and pH levels, the procedures followed in response to the fecal accident, including the process used to increase chlorine levels (if required), and the chlorine contact time must also be recorded. This record shall be kept for a minimum of one year, and be available upon request by the department.
