The next item was the Consideration of a 2022 Agreement with the Humane Society in the amount of \$90,474 (\$7,539.50 monthly). **Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Approve the 2022 Agreement with the Humane Society in the amount of \$90,474. Commissioner London seconded the motion which passed unanimously.** Commissioner Kleinhenz stated that this contract is for the Humane Society to provide shelter and to assist in sorting out those animals that are picked up by the County Animal Control Officers.

The next item was the Consideration of a 2022 Agreement for Legal Services with Attorney Grant Tucker in the amount of \$69,105 (\$5,758.75 monthly). Commissioner London motioned to Approve the 2022 Agreement with Attorney Grant Tucker in the amount of \$69,105. Commissioner Kleinhenz seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Consideration of a 2022 Agreement with Danny Hollander as County Engineer in the amount of \$90,805 (\$3,492.50 bi-weekly). It was noted that the State provides \$40,000 of this amount. Commissioner Lienhoop motioned to Approve the 2022 Agreement with Danny Hollander in the amount of \$90,805. The next item was the Consideration of a 2022 Agreement for Legal Services for the Bartholomew County Plan Commission with Attorney Jim Shoaf in the amount of \$18,000 (\$1,500 monthly). These funds come from the Code Enforcement Budget. **Commissioner Lienhoop**

Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Accept the Bids from E3 Bridge and from Civilcon, Inc. Commissioner London seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item, under Miscellaneous, was comments regarding the animal issues that were mentioned last week. Ms. Nancy Ray stated that the allegations that were made last week by Ms. Ziegler were not correct. They will take the high road at this point. They wish to continue to work to improve the lives of animals within the County. In no way does this group condone any illegal or harmful actions. Mr. Steve Schoettmer asked if the Precinct Maps have been approved and are they available. The Commissioners stated that they have been approved and he would need to contact Voter Registration to get a copy. Ms. Elaine DeClue asked if a person sees an animal in distress and calls Animal Control, will Animal Control get back with the caller? Mark Case, Animal Control Director, stated that they do not call back the caller. Commissioner Kleinhenz asked if we could try to conduct follow up calls with the person that calls in complaints. Commissioner London stated that we need to be careful regarding privacy concerns. His example was if he called something into the Sheriff's Department, he will not get a call back as it is a Sheriff's matter at that point and unless it directly affects him, he has no right to follow up information. Commissioner Kleinhenz would still like to see some type of follow up with the complainant. Commissioner Lienhoop stated that it was a good point and they will see what they can do. Mr. Carl Cameron stated that, as a member of the Change for Bartholomew County Advocacy, he wanted to reiterate Ms. Ray's comments and would like the Commissioners to continue to look into other County Animal Control Ordinances. He would like to see the laws on our books and how animal issues are handled change for the better. He encourages the Commissioners to move along with society as to how animals are seen going forward. He would like to see Bartholomew County and the City of Columbus make the changes that other areas have made. Councilman Jorge Morales noted that the Redevelopment Commission will meet today at 1:30 p.m. It is required to hold an Organizational Meeting on the first day of the year.

The next Commissioners Meeting will be **Monday**, **January 10**, **2022 at 10:00 a.m.** for their Organizational Meeting.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:46 a.m.
