## ELECTION BOARD MEETING

## MAY 18, 2018

President, James Holland reconvened the meeting in order to certify the election results of the 2018 Primary.

The minutes from the April 19<sup>th</sup> meeting were reviewed and approved by the board members.

The provisional ballots of Graham E. Thomason and Charles Denver Shepherd were unanimously added to the vote totals as both individuals had presented the proper identification to the Voter Registration Office within the 10 day time period following the election. Scott Mayes, Information Technology Director for Bartholomew County, updated the precinct summaries and vote count to reflect the added provisional ballots.

Eight ballots were received by mail to the Voter Registration after Election Day and therefore were not counted. These individuals were: Marci McCauley, Marie Jaggers, John Crouch, Janet Crouch, Wallace Cantrell, Jr., Sandra Cantrell, Beverley Denney, and Dorothy Kolopanis.

A report listing the Vote Centers by Turnout on Election Day was presented to the board for their review. It was unanimously decided that no changes would be made to the Vote Center locations for the 2018 General Election. After that time, the board will revisit the list of Vote Center locations to determine if any changes need to be made.

With no further business to review in regard to the 2018 Primary, the board members signed the Canvasser sheet to certify the election results.

Jay Phelps then presented the board with information regarding the new encoder that MicroVote has made available to its customers. This automated process eliminates the possibility of human error by entering the voter identification number and the possible selection of the wrong precinct. The board will study the information and make a determination about its usage for Bartholomew County at a later date.

With no further business to discuss, President, James Holland adjourned the meeting.
